Dear Susan & Geoff. A letter from you posted 15th Dec came this week - it is the letter I thought was lost. The snow has gone from here, but lies piled up at the side of the road to Chester & other Welsh mts are covered with snow. Harold took me to see Brian today & we went to a café to have tea, there were showers of hail & snow, but it melted immediately. Brian was very well, we had not seen him for about 5 weeks, owing to his being out the last time we went because the letter I sent had not reached him - & also on acc^t of the snow. Geoffrey has been in bed for 4 days with gastric flu & Barbara has had laryngitis, & had to stay in doors - tho' she could not stay in bed. I have been there every day so as to help & allow her to rest for an hour or two every afternoon. The weather was too bad to take Elizabeth out & she was very happy in the house. Brian went to see the Great Dictator & enjoyed it. It is being shown all over England. Mr. D'Arcy died a week ago - he was in his 98th.

Year. we did not know he was ill until after
the funeral - his housekeeper companion did not
let anyone know before. Sunday Pools froze but
soon melting them. NE wind. Bear + Geoffrey have
been out today for the first time for some days. Planes
(ours) flying overhead in sunshine - we have enjoyed
peaceful nights + days but expect more
attacks when settled weather comes. We all
have buckets of sand + water ready. Harold
gave 2 soldiers a lift to Queens Ferry Rd they
were going home to Rhyl but had to return after
2 hrs stay. Coming back we picked up ~~a~~ a soldier,
his wife + baby - he was having a weeks leave
from the S. coast wh: is well prepared for attack.

A car had balked into the snow piled up at the
side of the road + got stuck. I expect Oscar Lucy
will have to be registered this year but dental stu-
dents I believe are so far exempt. I fancy Harold
too will be called up, but I don't know if the Bank
will need him. I am sorry the flashlight was of
little use - I expect it got crushed. They have been
difficult to get. + so many have been bought.
Sweets are very scarce, they supply the Cau-
teens + S. A depots + Shelters, + shop keepers jars

are all empty on the counters -
I am knitting a coat for Elizabeth -
green wool - it & the leggings had been
given her but it was much too big
for Sefton & did not suit him so
I am reknitting it into double knitt-
ed coat for spring. Polly Conway
is coming to tea so I will get her
to post this on her way home - She
will leave soon after 6 o'clock
to get in before black-out. She
lives about 10 minutes (or less)
walk from here. I think the
children will be inoculated
against diphteria but the Dr.
does not want to do it yet -
Chester is a very good city
for web weather - There

are so many covered in (overhead) sidewalks - a very extensive covered in market - also Woolworth & other similar large shops, & also the Rows on the upper stories of the shops wh: are covered in & have good shop windows into wh: you can gaze & where you can do more expensive shopping. & then there is the Cathedral - all these are near together as it is a walled in old city. the streets are narrow & crowded with pedestrian cars, buses, & transport of all kind Brian does not wear overcoat or hat. & says he is not cold. This Auntie E's birthday today. With dear love from brother
