all approved much appreciated & the <sup>shop</sup> shop Thomas very like you



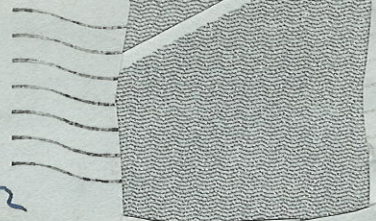
The little ones are very sweet. I am very sorry
