

(Sunday) March 11th 1928.

We are glad it is fine + bright for you but it is extremely cold; ice $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thick on the water tub + the Stairs wall covered with ice from the drip of the overflow pipe, Lawrence has been out morning + aft^r on his new motorbike. What about the potato in the tea pot + the egg in the tea canister? I got a surprise but I know it was Geoff. We miss you very very much, Daddy was saying he thought he was ^{even} more sorry to see you go than last time even. Well we must look forward again to seeing you in 2 yrs + 9 months. We keep picturing you on your way + we hope you are very comfortable on the voyage. There was a J. Card from Elsie Love for you it came by the 10 o'clock post. She wanted to be remembered to Mollie, + said Mr. Griffiths is making good progress now. We were just going to get ready to go out this aft^r when Mr. + Mrs. Conway came, they stayed to tea + have now gone to Drummerbeg + from there are going to Aunties. We are burning a few odd pieces

of wood today, & have a beautiful red fire.
We are to hear Eastbourne tonight on the wireless.
I wonder how the primroses carried. I hope you
don't have any fog or bad weather. Daddy
has gone to see Aunties & to warn them of
the approaching visitors. I am going to be
very busy spring cleaning so I won't have so
much time to feel lonely. We have so enjoyed
having you home dear Lads. We like to know
that you will each help & look after the
other. Whichever one reads it. I did not
go to Church this morning, but cooked
the dinner & had a nice fire ready
for Daddy & Dav. I hope you get your
gramophone & records to Cairnbank safely.
It seems a long time since we saw you yes-
