Helling.

Gregory works hard at the
hay & gets tired out but
will give in. They put
the hay inside a huge
barn - like a church - They
have very few haystacks
out in the open round
here - I suppose it is too
bleak.

Frank Clarke wrote
last Feb. & said he wd.
send another parcel but I
think it must have
got lost. We have enquired

having the Aunties here. They
think Mother looks much
better & I certainly think she
is happy here. The Aunties
seem to tire easily soon
get fussy but I think life
with all its upheavals this
last year has told on their

natural - Life here with our
two children is not as
peaceful as at Ben worth. I
